	The matter was debated, and further information <i>requested about the proposed</i> candidate
	It was unanimously decided that the matter be brought to the next meeting with a detailed paper to be provided.
	The need for the Council to have a proper officer until such time as the new temporary interim clerk could be appointed was discussed. Cllr M Parkinson offered to temporarily cover the position of Proper Officer until the new interim proper officer/clerk can be appointed.
	It was unanimously RESOLVED that Cllr M Parkinson would be the Proper Officer until such time as the new interim proper officer/clerk is appointed.

	One member requested to speak about Botley West Solar Farm proposal.

They raised the following points: -One of the main concerns is the scale of the development The distance from the development to the end supply, unlike nuclear which is far away solar can be closer to the end supply There are different options that should be considered Generation of energy on the doorstep for the community ETC The order of agenda items 5 and 6 were switched 05/11/22 ETC West Botley Solar Farm Phase One Community Consultation 06/11/22 To discuss WTC response to this pre-application consultation Cllr Parnes talked through the paper that was circulated prior to the meeting. The matter was then discussed, and various comments were made by the councillors including: -WODC land supply currently not met which may lead to speculative development. Suggested the funding be requested to install solar on building in the area It was highlighted that the decision is with the relevant Secretary of State and not the local planning authorities. The position from government on solar power is changing on a daily basis. It was pointed out that the plans do not show the contours of the land, the fencing size or how the rights of way will be blocked in. Can see the need for renewable energy but we are a windy not sunny country Increase in solar is intended to be on buildings etc not on farm land needed for food production Wind farms are more efficient then solar famrs It's the 2nd largest in Europe What happens at the end of life of the site? Meeting was informed that WODC Cllr Graham is arrange a meeting for all parishes effected to meeting and discuss the proposal. The clerk from Bladon has offered to provide a copy of Bladon's response, once approved by Bladon Parish Council, and to assist in writing the response on behalf of Woodstock Town Council. The councillors accept offer from Bladon's Clerk and a response is to be brought to the next meeting for consideration. ETC WTC response to OCC Consultation on Proposed Allocation of Parking to 07/11/22 hotels and Guest Houses Cllr M Parkinson declared an interest due to working in a business effected by the consultation. Cllr Parnes talked through the paper that was circulated. The following proposal was put forward Cllr Parnes and seconded by Cllr Grant. Woodstock Town Council resolves to issue a submission of objection to the County Council's proposed Hotel Visitors Parking Scheme as it does not provide a sufficiently robust solution to ongoing concerns about impact of the proposals. lacks disclosure of methodologies of assessment of potential effects in the absence of any broader economic impact assessment, does not address concerns of other businesses in the Town, and the exceptionally experimental

nature of the scheme in the current internationally volatile economic climate may irredeemably affect survivability of some businesses in the Town. The Town Council therefore requests further impact assessment and disclosure of the more detailed methodologies of consideration prior to implementation

The matter was then discussed, and various comments were made by the councillors including: -

- There is free parking after hours and the car park is also available
- How are the figures arrived at
- Not bringing benefits to Woodstock
- Compared to other towns this is over complicated
- Others give discount codes rather than a permit for a full day
- Payment for 24hrs should be allowed at machine and maybe offer a discount
- It works, so why fix it if it's not broken
- OCC should justify their calculations

The following amendment was proposed by Cllr M Parkinson and Second Cllr Grant

To add the following wording to the objection: Should meters be available please consider allowing 12 hour parking

Grille across the river at Watermeadows
