Woodstock History Notes - Democracy at work in Woodstock

"The time has now arrived when the battle to which we are mutually pledged is to be fought out to the uttermost." This announcement of the (parliamentary) election for the Borough of Woodstock in 1874 was written by the Whig candidate, one Mitchell Henry, in a polemical electioneering bill to be found in the town council's archives. It illustrates the division then existing between the House of Blenheim and burghers of Woodstock. In the event, Henry's Tory rival, Randolph Churchill, was returned to the seat.

Woodstock's local politics have usually included an anti-Blenheim faction. Sentiment surrounding the proposed Solar Farm on Blenheim Estate land is a current example. It is

an issue that might influence the Elections to the Woodstock Town Council - and subsequently that of its mayor - that are shortly to be held on 2 May.

Such elections could not always be taken for granted, as described in the Council's own online history: "By the early 1800s the Council almost ceased to exist. Factions sniped at one another, councillors stayed away from meetings and the entire administration became quite shambolic". In 1834 and 1835 the mayor was elected at a meeting attended only by the outgoing Mayor and the Clerk. The history goes on to state that, "eventually, in 1838, the rifts began to heal and the Council was once more established on a businesslike and democratic footing and has remained so to this day".

Let us hope that history will not repeat itself, and that the Electors of Woodstock town will do as Mitchell Henry exhorted them 150 years ago. "Assert, then, your independence, and elect the Candidate of your choice, for thereby you will obliterate the past, and place your Borough in a proud position in the Kingdom, and you will also secure the faithful services of those who will ever act in accordance with their principles."
